Our Encounter with Shaul and Julia

We met the couple in April 2024, during our visit to communities along the Gaza border, where we reported on the situation and provided support to affected families. Like many others, they were evacuated after the Hamas massacre on October 7 for security reasons but were able to return home after three months.

We experienced their home in Yated as a haven of hospitality and hope. While many areas along the Gaza border lay in ruins and ashes. Shaul and Julia welcomed us with warmth and optimism. They shared their dreams and plans - both for their personal future and for the revitalization and development of the region.

For us, they are a powerful symbol of Israeli resilience - a people who never give up but continue to rebuild their homeland in Zion, generation after generation.
